Religious Tolerance and the Attack on the World Trade Center

What were you doing on the morning of



September 11, 2001? What happened that day inspired one man to write a book on religious tolerance: One Mountain, Many Paths: Common Sense for the Spiritual Traveler, by Patrick Swift.

Swift explains that he had

first-hand experience as an eyewitness to the attacks on the World Trade Center, and this fundamentally changed his attitude toward life. His book, for him, "illuminates the common threads of faith, hope, and love from the great religious traditions that weave the human family together in a tapestry of peace."

The book contains 100 inspiring quotations selected from the top thirteen major world religions, and claims that on our spiritual journey, we remain much more alike than different.

Individual chapters include: One Mountain; Tolerance for Many Paths; Love One Another; Love Your Enemy; Forgiveness; Prayer; Peace for All; and One World. You need not read the book in any particular order.
